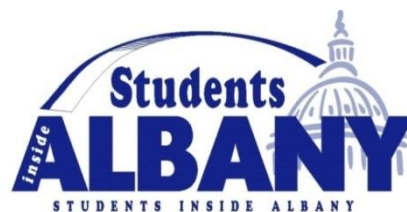

TWO LOCAL STUDENTS CHOSEN TO ATTEND STUDENTS INSIDE ALBANY PROGRAM

Haley Neiman, a junior at Rye High School, and Spencer Kaplan, a sophomore at Blind Brook High School, have been selected by the League of Women Voters - Rye, Rye Brook & Port Chester to attend this year's Students Inside Albany program to be held on May 17-20th.

This student conference, sponsored by the League of Women Voters of New York State Education Foundation, Inc., is designed to increase students' awareness of their responsibility in a representative government and to provide the tools necessary for meeting that responsibility. This interactive conference brings together approximately 60 high school students from across the state to learn about New York State government and the process by which citizens can participate in the policy making arena. As part of the program, students will tour the Capitol and observe the Senate and Assembly in action by spending an afternoon shadowing their legislators. Students will participate in a series of interactive discussions with Albany insiders on topics such as the state budget process, the role of lobbyists in the legislative process, the rights of citizens to access government information and the role of the media in politics. Student Civic Achievement Award

The Student Civic Achievement Award, a \$250.00 monetary award given annually to a high school junior who lives in and attends a high school in the City of Rye, Villages of Rye Brook and Port Chester, or the Rye Neck section of the Town of Rye, is a

recognition of the student's overall contributions to his or her school and community in the areas of civic engagement, advocacy, leadership or voter education.

The criteria for the Student Civic Achievement Award are:

* Proven civic engagement, such as participation and volunteering in school and community organizations, committees and boards; and/or

* Demonstrated advocacy for various causes, such as political, economic, education, civil, environmental or quality of life issues; and/or

* Proven leadership roles in school and community organizations, committees and boards; and/or

* Demonstrated interest in voter education.

Application forms have been sent by the League to the local schools in early January **and the deadline for submission of those application forms is March 31.**

The student participants in this year's "Tools for Change" program are researching the pros and cons of **extending the right to vote to sixteen year olds**. Additionally, they received American flags, Flag Code brochures, voting information and flag lapel pins from the Jewish American War Veterans, the Daughters of the American Revolution and the League of Women Voters.

Barbara Brunner represented our chapter at the ceremony. Following the ceremony new citizens take advantage of the opportunity to apply for a U. S. passport and to register to vote.

Annual LWV Spring Luncheon At the Orienta Beach Club, Friday, April 24th, Noon-2:00 PM

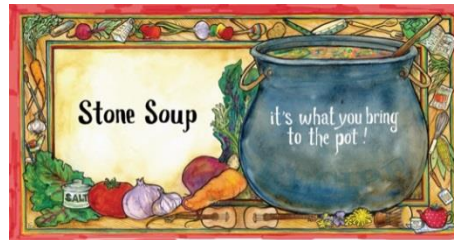

This was the first event in what will be a series of structured programs around issues that impact community. In other words, we are bringing together people who share



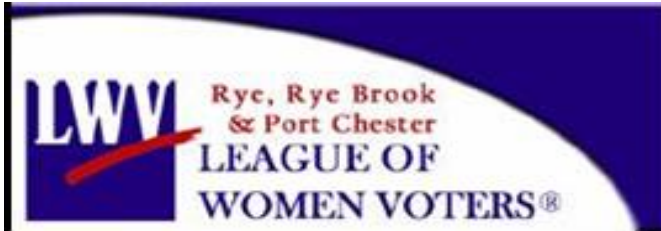
