- 1. Identify other organizations that would be good to partner with:
 - Local Chapters of National Organizations
 - Local community organizations
 - Education-based organizations
 - Religious Organizations (social action committees)
 - Business organizations
 - Local Media

- 2. Develop a relationship with them
 - Create personal connections by reaching out on a specific topic, inviting them to coffee, identifying like interests
 - Join their organization, attend their meetings and events
 - Invite them to co-sponsor an educational event, or to be a promoting sponsor (and let them know we are willing to do the same).
 - Ask them to share information with their distribution lists (and let them know we are willing to do the same).

3. Lessons Learned

- Maintain a spreadsheet of organizations, contact person at organization, and league connection, date of interaction. Don't let your connections go stale – organizations change and so do we
- Consider a partnership agreement. We interpret partnership as:
 - Sharing each other's social media posts
 - Helping to promote events either of us has
 - Co-sponsoring events both are interested in doing
 - Learn what partnership between our organizations means to them
- Reach out to them when considering expanding membership and for Board Nominations
