State Leaders Message

This month we witnessed several actions from our country's Executive branch that strongly oppose the core values of the League. We pushed back by sending a letter to Congressional leadership about the state of our nation. The letter, signed by leadership from every state League in

the country and DC affiliate, expressed strong concern over Congress abandoning its duties and authorities under Article I of the U.S. Constitution and urged leaders to address the unprecedented executive branch overreach threatening American democracy. You can read the letter here.

We will continue to push back against actions that counter our values. One of the ways in which it's imperative we do this is through our work around diversity, equity, inclusion, and justice. Ensuring diversity, equity, inclusion and justice initiatives thrive is key to our work defending democracy. The formal inclusion of DEI initiatives can largely be traced back to the 1960s and the civil rights movement along with the Civil Rights Act of 1964. Activists, like former League member Shirley Chisholm, were instrumental in its expansion to cover gender equity. We have watched DEI expand into



the workplace and advance initiatives like equal pay and the legalization of samesex marriage. Let's keep DEI as the lens we view our work, each and every day. We also would like to highlight an **Action Alert** to all members calling on the US House and Senate to commit to the Constitution. This builds on the letter that all 51 state Leagues joined that went to heads of both Chambers. Please share this **action alert** across the League network.




