At the League's 2023 Convention, members voted to conduct two studies, one on the approval process of New York State's voting systems and the other on rank choice voting and open primaries.

REMINDER:

Responses are due **May 15**, **2025**. We are urging all local Leagues to participate in the approval process and have member meetings to discuss the materials and the position statements. Group discussion is an essential part of the study process. We need as many Leagues as possible to reach the required level of participating Leagues.

 Rank Choice Voting and Open Primaries Study

Program planning materials have been released and were due March 15th. If your Local League has not submitted their program planning recommendations to the state League by the due date, then late recommendations will not be considered. This is the only method for suggesting new studies to be adopted at Convention 2025. Changes in the state League program cannot be suggested for the first time at Convention.


