Lobby Day 2025- LWVNYS would like to thank everyone who joined us and participated in this year's Lobby Day at the NYS Capitol. We had the opportunity to speak with representatives about our legislative priorities for this year and hosted a press conference with our partners at the NY BIPOC Democracy Table to highlight key democracy issues here in New York. This year we held 50 meetings with



lawmakers and had **65** advocates join us to lobby. We had members join us from as far west as Chautauqua (west of Buffalo!) and as far south as Long Island.
