Let's be honest. We're all feeling a mix of emotions—anger, frustration, fear. But here's the thing: we don't have the luxury of giving up. We have no choice but to be hopeful, to fight back, and to continue the work that strengthens our democracy.

While the election is behind us, the League of Women Voters of New York continues to show up, just as we always do. Democracy isn't just an Election Day priority—it's an everyday commitment.

New Yorkers in November passed overwhelmingly the NY ERA Amendment by voting YES on Proposition One. Now is the time to pass the Federal ERA. The League of Women Voters has shown its commitment by sending thousands of letters to President Biden asking him to certify the Equal Rights Amendment. The Equal Rights Amendment (ERA), which will update the US Constitution to protect the equality of rights under the law regardless of sex, can be added to the Constitution with one action. With just over a month left in office, we are urging President Biden to act to ensure that the ERA is published. Please send a letter to President Biden urging him to immediately publish the Equal Rights Amendment.
