We're in the final stretch to Election Day, and I want to express my deep appreciation for everyone working overtime to empower voters and defend democracy. We owe huge gratitude to the people who made our elections run: the poll workers, election officials, election observers, postal workers, and volunteers.

Elections are how we shape the world we want. Once they are cast, our votes must be respected, no matter the results. Beware of false claims about the election results. We expect bad actors to spread disinformation to cast doubt for their own political gain.

As we wait for votes to be counted, we know that this waiting period is exactly what should be happening. Election officials are working around the clock to count ALL ballots, and it's essential that they take the time to make sure every vote is counted. Remember: a complete and accurate ballot count is more important than a fast ballot count. We may not get a complete count on election night, and that's OK — it means our trusted election administrators are counting every ballot.

# Early Voting Records Broken Across the State!

This week New Yorkers leaned into early voting and broke turn out <u>records</u> in the first weekend. The number of voters in the first weekend of early voting was almost double the number of voters that turned out the first week of early voting in 2020.

Sunday, November 3rd marks the last day of early voting before Election Day on November 5th. If you are voting via absentee ballot or early vote by mail ballot you must postmark your ballot by November 5th. You can also drop it off



at an early voting poll site, your election day poll site on November 5th, or your county board of elections.

# Why won't we know the results of the election on November 5th?

- In New York, absentee ballots and early vote by mail ballots have until November 12th to arrive at the Board of Elections. Ballots will still need to be counted after election day.
- Sometimes voters may make a mistake on their absentee ballot or early vote by mail ballot. Voters have up to 7 days to fix or "cure" their ballot, meaning we may not have the total count until several weeks after Election Day.
- Counting ballots takes time. Our county board of elections across the state are working hard to make sure the election is running smoothly and that every ballot is counted.

#### Reminders

- Flip your ballot!
- Check your polling place at Vote411.org before heading to the polls
- If you submitted an absentee ballot or early vote by mail ballot you can track it <a href="here">here</a>. You must submit your ballot or have it postmarked by November 5th.
- If you are in line when the polls close, stay in line. As long as you are in line you can cast your ballot.
- Do not leave the polls without voting. If you are not in the poll book you have the right to vote via affidavit ballot.
